



Savward Volunteer Fire/Rescue Department

The Sayward Valley Volunteer Fire/Rescue Department was established 55 years ago and initially serving the village and later expanding to include the valley as well. The Rescue Society was formed in 1986 to help fill the need for motor vehicle accident and medical call assistance. The two groups merged ten years ago to form the Sayward Volunteer Fire/Rescue Department and is administered through the Village of Sayward. The coverage area now includes - Road Rescue and Medical Calls all of Sayward and Hwy 19 from Rock Bay Forest Service Road to Eve River Rest Area plus areas of logging road in between. Fire Area all of Sayward plus Hwy 19

south to 1411, and Big Tree Creek Hatchery. If directed by Wildland Fire other logging roads are attended. For the detailed service area map go to Saywardfire.ca As a volunteer fire department all members give their time to train, practice and to help us when there is a fire,

rescue or medical need. All training in fire fighting, rescue extraction and first responder licence is paid for by the department. And, it is a great group of people to know and be a part of.

Thank you for your service to all these dedicated people who do so much for the safety of others, and to Pat Rusch for the information for this article.

There are two Fire Halls, one in Village at 620 Kelsey Way, and the other at 1306 Sayward Road in the valley. All equipment is shared between the two halls and is used on all calls regardless of the location. Equipment includes two fire trucks, one tanker, two rescue trucks, and a structure protection unit

The SVFD is always recruiting and accepting new members. To connect phone fire department and leave a message at 250-282-5505 or come to the meetings on Monday night at 7pm Hall 1 in the Village. Visit saywardfire.ca for more details on information about burning, wildfire season, safety practises and more.

Reminder: Fireworks are Prohibited


Reminder to Village of Sayward Residents: Fireworks Regulation Bylaw No. 481, 2022 is in effect and will be enforced at all times.

Please note: "No individual shall explode, light, activate, fire or discharge Fireworks within the boundaries of the Village unless that individual is authorized to do so under a valid Fireworks Permit issued under this Bylaw."

Anyone who lights, fuels or uses an open fire when a fire prohibition is in place or fails to comply with an **open fire prohibition** may be issued a ticket in accordance to the Village of Sayward Ticketing Bylaw or, if convicted in court, be fined up to \$100,000 and/or sentenced to one year in jail. If the contravention causes or contributes to a wildfire, the person responsible may be subject to a penalty of up to \$100,000 and ordered to pay all firefighting and associated costs.

Garden Club News

By the time you read this we will have had our first frosty night. Some vegetables like beets can tolerate a bit of freezing but will need to be harvested soon. Cabbages can be left in the garden but you have to watch for them splitting and going into the seeding stage. The Brussels Sprouts will continue to grow and can be harvested even after a snow.

Now is a good time to build a compost with non-seeding weeds and other garden refuse. Grass clippings can provide the needed nitrogen along with animal manures. Turning the pile every two weeks and keeping the pile covered to protect from cooling rain will soon provide usable compost.

The October meeting of the Garden Club was a grand success with over thirty people attending. Our guest speaker Chanchal Cabrera, is a herbal therapist from the Comox Valley. She spoke on the use of locally available plants as medicinal agents. She was cautious about abruptly abandoning convention medications but did show how common plants including stinging nettle, lemon balm, calendula and dandelion all have therapeutic uses. Chanchal, had useful responses to questions from the attendees and everyone was very satisfied with the event.

The next meeting of the club will be at 7:00 on Thursday, November 14 at the Heritage Hall. Members are reminded to please bring any garden excesses, plants, plant divisions and collected seeds for the Opportunity Table. Donations made to the table are one of our important sources of funds to finance future speakers. Please join our friendly group.

The Village of Sayward in conjunction with the Strathcona Regional District uses **Alertable** as our public emergency mass notification service.


Alertable can notify residents, visitors, and businesses of emergencies in a timely manner to people who subscribe to receive these alerts. It can also be used to notify residents of other non-emergency items such as scheduled road closures, power outages, water and sewer alerts, and much more. This service is free.

The system is compatible with mobile phones, tablets, computers or smart speakers. It can also send alerts via text message, voice calls to land lines, and e-mail.

KELSEY BAY WHARF PROJECT

PRESENT

Kelsey Bay Wharf is proudly owned and operated by Sayward Futures Society. The Society's buildings on the wharf house the Oceanview Gallery & Cafe and the Sayward Visitor Centre. Located in the Johnstone Strait, along the inside passage of the beautiful Vancouver Island, BC, Canada, it is home to a host of marine life—all easily viewed from the very popular wharf—orcas, humpbacks, sea lions, sea otters, dolphins, and jellyfish. In the summer you can catch salmon and halibut right off the wharf, and can purchase your fishing license from us as well as rent a rod!

PAST

Historically a government wharf, built in Kelsey Bay just north of the mouth of the Salmon River — Union Steamships would dock bringing freight, mail and passengers. William and Imogene Kelsey operated a store and telegraph office at the wharf as well as the post office to serve the region's outlying settlements. As a result, the bay was officially named Kelsey Bay. After World War II ended, a gravel road was built connecting the communities from the south to Sayward. The Kelsey Bay Wharf was BC Ferries southern terminus for the Inside Passage route until 1978. Once Highway 19 was paved and extended to Port Hardy, and the ferry terminal relocated.

FUTURE

Sayward Futures Society recently engaged McElhanney Engineering to provide a complete assessment of the Kelsey Bay Wharf. We are now seeking to secure much needed funding for rehabilitation of this important community amenity for commercial and recreational use including:

- Stabilization of the pilings and supports to allow vehicle traffic and larger vessels
- Replacement of shore-side 'finger wharf'
- Upgrades/expansion of current buildings, water power, and septic services
- Replacement of safety equipment and repairs to decking as needed

SAYWARD RECREATION SITES

ELK CREEK



Just 500yds north of the Sayward Junction you'll find this beautiful, forested creekside site with a trail on the south side of the access road. Visit nearby Sayward Village, Kelsey Bay Wharf's

Oceanview Gallery & Cafe, the Sayward Visitor Centre, and hike through the Salmon River Estuary trials.

STEWART LAKE



You will find Stewart Lake about 37km south of Sayward, where there are four sites nestled in an old growth forest at lakes' edge, a fifth site is perched on a hill across the road and a trail

circles the lake through the trees. A very popular spot for fishing, restricted to electric motors, and has a steep cartop boat launch within the site.

TLOWILS LAKE



Just 20km north of the Sayward Junction, this site is nestled amongst a small old growth cedar grove on the beautiful Tlowils Lake. This site has a cartop boat launch with five smaller sites more

appropriate for tenting or a truck and camper.

SANTA MARIA DAY SITE



A short drive of 7km from the Sayward Junction, this gorgeous little day getaway is wonderful for picnicking, fishing, canoeing, kayaking or just lounging for the day!
